



# Meeting Minutes

# September 2018 Meeting

Friday, September 28, 2018 - 8:30 am - 125 Putnam Pike, Dayville, CT

Mr. Ives, NECCOG Chair, opened the meeting at 8:30 am

Member Towns Represented: Brooklyn, Canterbury, Eastford, Killingly, Pomfret, Plainfield, Putnam, Scotland, Thompson, Union and Voluntown

The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted and action on the previous meeting minutes were tabled for the October meeting. There was no public participation or additional agenda items.

The Executive Director, John Filchak, updated the Council on the following matters:

- Scotland Zoning Re-write
- Pomfret Branding Strategy
- ▶ Pomfret Airline Trail Assistance
- Voluntown POCD
- Plainfield Transit Re-Introduction explaining that the initiative is now in some level of doubt.
- Transit District Operations
- 125 Putnam Pike Purchase Director reported that he had a productive meeting with Killingly and is now working with the NECCOG attorney to draft the purchase agreement.
- Crumbling Foundations Director shared that progress is being made with the Captive Insurance Company and that he was optimistic that payments will begin before the end of the calendar year.
- ► DEMHS Region 4 Activities Director noted that the new budget was adopted.
- Approval of CEDS (DECD) from the State Director reported that the second of the two

- state approvals is now secured and that NECCOG will now make application to EDA for federal status.
- Natural Hazard Mitigation Update Director reported that the update process has begun
- Transportation Staff is working with multiple towns on projects for submission.
- Animal Shelter Director reported that the RFP submittals had been reviewed by the advisory committee and that they had made a recommendation.
- New Veteran's Grant (5310) for \$284,000 -Director informed the Council of the grant award (the application as made about three years ago) and the issue that there are no vehicles for the service as we had anticipated using surplus transit vehicles.
- Pre-Hospital Emergency Care Study Study is underway - with a kick-off meeting having been held.
- Regional Human Services/Veteran's Advisor -Until such time that staffing can be secured -

- existing staff (Ms. Flexer) will cover this program.
- Regional Audit Services Program Status working with NECCOG attorney on approaches
- CCM Annual Meeting Workshop Director has been asked to speak on the future of COGs
- ACIR examining how the legislature should identify the fiscal impacts of proposed legislation/state budget - Director is chairing this effort

### **Discussion and Action Items**

- 1. Resolution 9-1-18, Endorsement of New Transit Routes and Addition of Plainfield as a Full Member of NECTD The Director discussed the current situation with re-introducing transit services to the town and that the prospect has diminished for the immediate future. Ms. Tendrich asked that the resolution be withdrawn which as seconded by Mr. Griffiths passed unanimously. Mr. Griffiths made a new motion that NECCOG be supportive of Plainfield's efforts to establish transit service for its town and that the resolution be held pending more information/action. This motion as seconded by Mr. Syme and it passed unanimously.
- 2. Presentation **Pre-Hospital Emergency Care Study Process Overview** Bob Holdsworth, President The Holdsworth Group, Inc. overviewing the study and the data needs from each EMS service and town.
- 3. Selection of Recommended Architect Firm for the Updated Animal Shelter Silver, Pertrucelli and Associates of Hamden, CT. Motion by Mr. Beausoleil and second by mr. Syme to select the recommended firm passed unanimously.

THIS IS 17.74 Percent Decrease
