a. Transit Activities

• Although still below 'normal', transit ridership statistics for all services remain steady with a slight upward trend.

b. Animal Services Program

- The start date for the Town of Norwich is still to be determined.
- Activities such as adoptions, redemptions, investigations, and impounded animals have not been affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

c. Paramedic Intercept Program

- Paramedic services have remained steady.

 - Bills were sent out to members for review.
- e. Transportation Projects/Initiatives, UPWP Draft
 - Unified Planning Work Program, two year work program with ConnDOT 2022-2023
 - EDA Recovery Grant draft was submitted and due to be reviewed in the next month or two.
 - Develop a pandemic focused Economic Recovery and Resilience Plan
 - Provide Disaster Recovery Support to the regions Recovery Steering Committee and subcommittees
 - Host a series of virtual entrepreneurial meet-ups, educational webinars and/or other virtual networking functions that bring together new and existing businesses.
 - Establish and maintain an on-line presence/website, for a two year period, to assist in the economic recovery of identified sector(s) in the region.

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f. Crumbling Foundations

- 47 affected communities 1,729 applications
- In the last 24 months, 291 families have had their foundations replaced
- Average cost of remediated foundation \$154,236

 - CT will receive \$4.3 billion in state and local town relief. Allocations for State are within 60 days of enactment. Once received, it will be distributed within 30 days to towns.

 - Independent nonprofit 501 c3 launched in 2014
 - Serves as one of eight regional "field offices" of the CT Offices of the Art to support Department of Economic & Community Development.
 - Free partnership (membership) organization
 - Mission is to improve the economy, vitality and quality of life in Southeastern CT by supporting arts, cultural and creative community.
- c. Community Project Funding Emma King, District Director Congressman Courtney emma.king@mail.house.gov
 - Project formerly known as Earmark where members can submit community projects.
 - Provides an opportunity for small local initiatives that are critical to our regionals recovery to be funded directly by the federal government in legislation, not by a competitive grant process.
 - This year there will be two: One though the appropriations committee and another through the large surface transportation authorization which is part of a larger infrastructure bill.
