### **Panel Discussion**

## Housing

- Unite CT funding purpose if the funding is to help those that are already housed and behind on rent and/or may be facing eviction due to finances. There is also funding to help with rental assistance for future rent payments.
- United Way in New London county has mobile units that can be scheduled to come out to Connecticut towns. The mobile units provide access to computers with internet to help with with applications.
- Access Agency helps with mortgage, rent, and utility assistance. Those that are seeking
  to apply are required to make an appointment at their local Access Agency office. Prior to
  arrival, it is important that applicants have access to a personal email, bring utility
  statements, mortgage statements, rental agreements, and at minimum 8 weeks of
  income/revenue statements.

### Mental Health

- Diane Manning, President/CEO United Services, Inc. shared: In comparison to last year's data, Crisis Response Services are up 237% this year.
- Increase of referrals for psychiatric care from primacy care providers and schools.
- Large increase in alcoholism mental and physical effects of alcoholism are expected to linger beyond COVID-19 pandemic.

### **Identified Unmet Needs Status**

- Some unmet needs that have been reviewed and are in progress are:
  - Reaching senior citizens who have not been able to utilize in person assistance and working on their individual needs.
  - Need for diaper banks resources currently in the works
  - Transportation challenges associated with vaccination clinic are in progress NECTD and SEAT are provided prescheduled rides to those that have appointments for vaccines.
  - Efforts are the state and federal level to improve broadband access to individual households and communities
