 - Ridership has been increasing despite limited capacity on buses at one given time.
 - From Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day weekend, weekend transit services are free.
 - Senior & Disabled ridership numbers are still low.
 - Plainfield bus service has increased 125% since first month of pilot launch.
