a. Transit Activities

- Ridership has diminished due to COVID-19. Social distancing has effected ridership due to limited capacity of 5 riders at one given time. Mask requirements are still in place.
- Elderly and Disabled ridership below average as well. Demographic that used this service may be hesitant to use public transportation due to the pandemic.
- Plainfield Bus Service has been successful despite COVID-19. July 2021 ridership reached 306 at an all time high since the pilot program began.

b. Animal Services Program

- Activities such as adoptions, redemptions, investigations, and impounded animals have not been affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Towns of Norwich and Scotland are to join NECCOG Animal Services Program for upcoming fiscal year.
- Animal Services Officers will be at the Norwich facility daily to help close the gap in response time for the southern participating towns. There are 21 kennels, a cattery, and large recreational area.
- NECCOG Animal Services is currently housing 14 birds, 18 dogs, 27 cats, and 2 rabbits due to the result of two search and seizures.

c. Crumbling Foundations

NECCOG meetings are conducted in accessible locations and materials can be provided in accessible formats free of charge upon request (including but not limited to interpreters in American Sign Language and languages other than English, open or closed captioning for videos, alternative material formats such as audio, Braille, and large print), as available. Interpreter and other translation requests must be made at least fourteen (14) business days before the meet ing. Materials in alternative formats must be requested at least three (3) business days prior to the meeting.

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- Congressman Courtney Create a Pyrrhotite Remediation Program: H.R. 4502, a legislative package containing the majority of appropriations bill for FY 2020 secured \$2,000,000 to provide assistance to homeowners and condominium owners impacted by crumbling concrete foundations due to the mineral pyrrhotite...This project could provide gap financing to homeowners or help those who may never receive assistance from the captive insurance company to repair their foundations.
- NECCOG/CRCOG are preparing a grant application through State/FEMA for assistance to commercial and public structures.
