Resolution 8-1-23 Fiscal Year 2024 Regional Services Grant and Authorization for the

Executive Director to Execute and Deliver the Agreement on Behalf of NECCOG

WHEREAS, the Northeastern Connecticut Council of Governments (NECCOG) is one of nine statutorily created regional councils of governments established under Sec. 16a-4c of the Connecticut General Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the 16 member municipalities of region have voluntarily created NECCOG, by adopting Secs. 4-124i through 4-124p, of the General Statutes, through local ordinance to carry out a variety of regional planning and other activities on their behalf, as authorized under Chapter 127, of the General Statutes; and

WHEREAS, NECCOG in accordance with C.G.S. Secs. 4-66k and 4-66r, as amended by Sec. 93 of PA 23-204 and Sec. 155 of PA 23-205 and in accordance with the Statement of Work prepared by NECCOG and submitted to OPM is eligible for a **Regional Services Grant for FY 2024** in the amount of **\$470,851.88**; and

WHEREAS, NECCOG desires to accept the Regional Services Grant for FY 2024 and to have its Executive Director execute, on behalf of the organization, all related documents related to this grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that:

- 1. That the Northeastern Connecticut Council of Governments execute and deliver to the State of Connecticut a Notice of Grant Award (the "Agreement") in the amount of \$470,851.8 for the 2024 Regional Services Grant.
- 2. **John Filchak** as **Executive Director** of the Northeastern Connecticut Council of Governments is directed to execute and deliver the Agreement on behalf of the Organization and to do all things necessary or appropriate to carry out the terms of the Agreement, including executing and delivering all agreements and documents contemplated by the Agreement.

Resolution 8-2-23 Reaffirmation of NECCOG's Commitment to the

Sustainable Materials Management (SMM) Grant Program to Fund a Feasibility Study the a Regional Environmental Depot

WHEREAS, the Northeastern Connecticut Council of Governments (NECCOG) submitted, on March 31, 2023, a grant application for funding through the Sustainable Materials Management Regional Waste Authority Grant Program administered by the Department of Energy & Environmental Protection (DEEP); and

WHEREAS, NECCOG's purpose in seeking funding is to conduct a feasibility analysis for a regional Environmental Depot to serve as a one-stop location and education center where residents from the region may responsibly dispose a range of residential items keeping them from the municipal solid waste stream or the random disposal into the environment in an unchecked manner; and

WHEREAS, on July 27, 2023 DEEP notified the nine applicants, which includes NECCOG, for funding through this program that the total requests for funding totaled \$3.2 million and that a total of \$1.5 million had been allocated for this program; and

WHEREAS, DEEP requested additional information in the form of 10 questions to supplement each applicants original application - including "evidence of explicit support from municipal Chief Elected Officials."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Northeastern Connecticut Council of Governments, which is made up of each of the 16 member town's chief elected official, affirm their explicit support to secure funding through the Sustainable Materials Management (SMM) Grant Program to fund a feasibility study for a Regional Environmental Depot.

- A. The proposed service will be available to or benefit all participating members regardless of such members' participation in the grant application process;
- B. When compared to the existing delivery of services, the proposal demonstrates (i) a positive cost benefit, (ii) increased efficiency and capacity in the delivery of services, (iii) a diminished need for state funding, and (iv) increased cost savings;
- C. The proposed service promotes cooperation among participating members that may lead to a reduction in economic or social inequality;
- D. The proposal has been approved by a majority of the members of the council and contains a statement that not less than twenty-five per cent of the cost of such proposal shall be funded by the council in the first year of operation, and that by the fourth year of operation the council shall fund one hundred per cent of such cost; and
- E. Any employee organizations that may be impacted by a proposal have been informed of and consulted about the proposal.

- 1. The provision of any service that one or more participating municipalities of such council or local or regional board of education of such regional educational service center currently provide but which is not provided on a regional basis,
- 2. the **redistribution of grants** (Small Town Economic Assistance Program, Main Street Investment Fund, Inter-town Capital Equipment Purchase Incentive Program, and Local Capital Improvement Fund grants), or
- 3. regional revenue sharing among municipalities that have entered certain agreements to do so.



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Regional Inspection and Enforcement Program

The proposed service would provide timely, uniform building plan reviews, building permits permits, inspections and compliance enforcement. Additionally, this new regional service will include land use (zoning and wetlands) enforcement. The objective is to provide participating towns with professional inspection and enforcement services as well as being a clearinghouse for information regarding building and land use compliance.

Regional Municipal Assessment Services

Through NECCOG, a common set of certified assessors (preferably ones already working in the region) will be provided to each participating town (3-4 are anticipated) to enable such towns to have consistent, reliable and cost-effective assessment services.


Municipal Administrative Services

The proposed regional service will provide professional town management services for the region's smaller towns through NECCOG as a means to ensure continuity of operations, budgeting, finance, HR and other ongoing functions - enabling local elected officials to focus on policy.







- 1. **Description** of the service or initiative;
- 2. Explanation of the need for such service or initiative;
- 3. The method of delivering such service or initiative on a regional basis;
- 4. The organization that would be responsible for regional service or initiative delivery;
- 5. A description of the population that would be served;
- 6. The manner in which the proposed regional service or initiative delivery will achieve economies of scale for participating parties;
- 7. The amount by which participating municipalities will reduce their mill rates as a result of savings realized;
- 8. A cost benefit analysis for the provision of the service or initiative;
- 9. A plan of implementation on a regional basis;
- 10. A resolution endorsing the proposal
- 11. A formal commitment that not less than twenty-five per cent of the cost of such proposal shall be funded by the council in the first year of operation, and that by the fourth year of operation the council or center shall fund one hundred per cent of such cost;
- 12. A resolution endorsing the proposal approved by the COG;
- 13. An acknowledgment from any employee organization that may be impacted by such proposal that they have been informed of and consulted about the proposal; and
- 14. An explanation of the potential legal obstacles, if any,, and how such obstacles will be resolved.
